Purpose: Establish the Pre-Apprenticeship Policy of the Workforce Development Board Mid-Ohio Valley (WDBMOV) for services offered through Title I of the Workforce Innovation and Opportunity Act (WIOA).

References: Workforce Innovation and Opportunity Act, Section 122(a)(2), 129(c)(2)(C)(ii), 20 CFR 681.480, TEGL 13-16; WorkForce WV WIOA Policy No. 05-16

Background: Youth Pre-Apprenticeship is a type of work experience, which is included in the 20% work experience expenditure priority of service for the youth program. Work Experience is one of the 14 youth program elements required to be made available to youth participants.

Policy: The Workforce Development Board Mid-Ohio Valley (WDBMOV) will utilize this policy when it applies to pre-apprenticeship opportunities within the Youth program.

Pre-apprenticeship programs provide instruction and/or training to increase math, literacy, and other vocational and pre-vocational skills needed to gain entry into a Registered Apprenticeship program. Implementing Registered Apprenticeship and pre-apprenticeship models that are aligned with the needs of key industry sectors creates opportunities to advance students, job seekers, and workers along the talent pipeline. A pre-apprenticeship program funded with WIOA funding must have at least one Registered Apprenticeship partner; such pre-apprenticeship programs must possess or develop a strong record of enrolling their pre-apprenticeship graduates into a Registered Apprenticeship program. If a youth participant wishes to be enrolled in the Registered Apprenticeship program, and if his/her funding has not been exhausted, a portion and/or the balance of funding may be used to cover the costs of the Registered Apprenticeship program's classroom training/related instruction. Any adult program participant will follow WDB-MOV ITA policy #12.

A pre-apprenticeship program will include the following elements:

- 1. Training and curriculum that aligns with the skill needs of employers in the economy of the State or region involved
- Access to educational and career counseling and other supportive services, directly or indirectly
- 3. Hands-on, meaningful learning activities that are connected to education and training activities, such as exploring career options, and understanding how the skills acquired through coursework can be applied toward a future career;

- 4. Opportunities to attain at least one industry-recognized credential; and
- 5. A partnership with one or more registered apprenticeship program that assists placing individuals who complete the pre-apprenticeship program in a Registered Apprenticeships program.

Pre-apprenticeship programs are paid through youth work experience funds or Adult ITA funds. If Adult ITA funds are to be utilized, the pre-apprenticeship program must be on the state eligible training provider list and follow WDBMOV ITA Policy #12.

Action: The American Job Center (AJC) shall inform individuals applying for or receiving services under Title I of the WIOA of their rights under this policy. All recipients and subrecipients of WIOA funds through Region 4 shall be required to verify compliance with this policy. Failure to follow this policy shall result in disapproval of funds.

Expiration Date: This policy shall be in effect until revised or canceled by the Workforce Development Board Mid-Ohio Valley.
